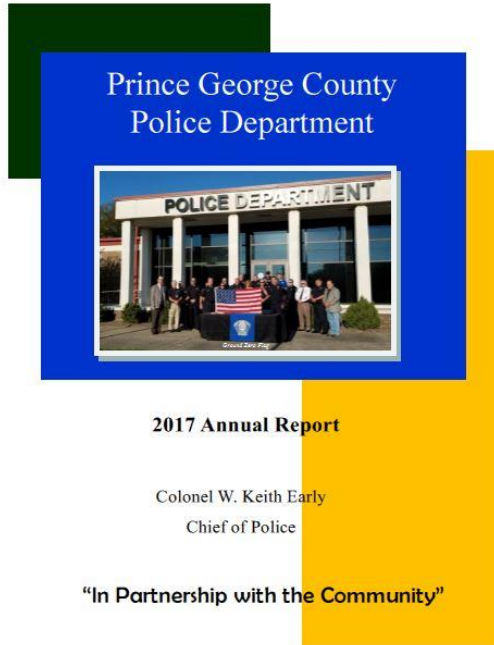
Paw & Order Calendar a Success

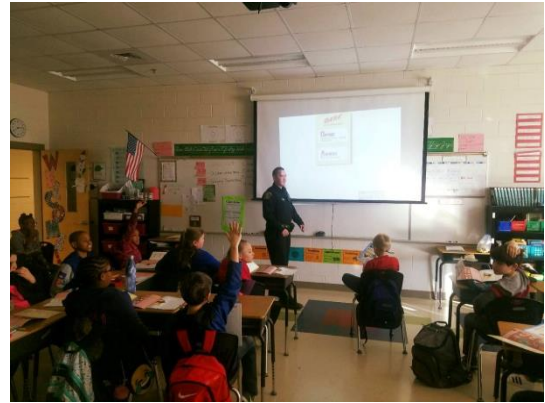
